Food and Drink Manufacturing in Scotland has a turnover of **£10.4bn**

The industry employs **more people** and has **greater opportunity** for future employment than other sectors

Out of the food & drink manufacturing

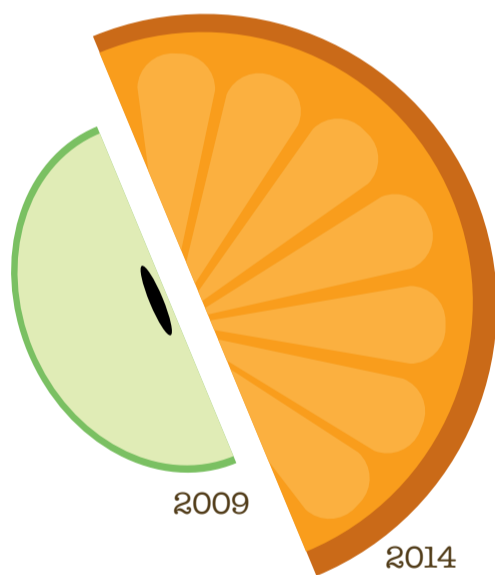
£3.6bn gross value added,

in 2013/14

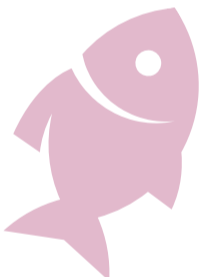
This is an increase of **31%** over the last five years

The Scottish food & drink manufacturing employs **43,300** people. Around **61%** of people working in the sector are men and **39%** are women. **91%** of the Scottish food & drink manufacturing workforce is employed on a **full time basis**

The average full time salary in the Food Manufacturing sector in Scotland is

£21,100

and in beverages is

£37,500

This is compared to an average salary of **£25,600** across the whole economy and **£30,000** across other manufacturing sectors

There are around **815** enterprises, operating

out of **1,125**

sites in the **Scottish Food & Drink sector**. This is around

14% of the **Manufacturing**

sector in the country

The three largest subsectors in Scotland are
